## **Sizing Requirements**

Bleed Line The

The bleed line is an area 0.125" larger than the die height and width that allows our converting team to compensate for the natural shifting that occurs during the converting process. Please be sure to extend the background colors and/or patterns that you would like to bleed off of your label all the way to the bleed line.

Die Line

Safe Zone

The die line is the exact shape and size of your final label. Please make sure that no part of your design ends or begins directly on the die line. Your design should either reach the bleed line or fit inside of the safe zone to protect your artwork from being cut into.

The safe zone is an area 0.125" smaller than the die height and width that is safe during the converting process. Within this area, all text and other design elements are far enough away from the die line to not be at risk of being cut off.
